SOFIA COPPOLA'S FAVORITE SPOTS TO EAT AND DRINK IN NAPA

Right after her momentous Best Director win at this year's Cannes Film Festival for her latest film **The Beguiled**, Sofia Coppola jetted directly home to Napa Valley to celebrate and decompress with her family. The filmmaker was on hand to serve as an honorary chair for the 37th annual **Auction Napa Valley** (Napa's biggest and glitziest party of the year, which raised a whopping \$15.7 million to benefit community health and children's education), along with her parents Eleanor and Francis, brother Roman, and niece Gia.

"It's been so nonstop," she said in an interview at Inglenook, the historic Napa Valley winery her dad bought in the '70s, this past weekend before the Napa Valley Barrel Auction got underway. "When I got back from Cannes, we opened some of the Méthode [Sofia Méthode Champenoise sparkling wine] and the sparkling rosé [Sofia Brut Rosé] to celebrate. Last night, we had a dinner and we all drank a little too much wine because, well, how could you resist?"

The filmmaker, who was born in New York, spent her teen years growing up in Northern California wine country. We asked Coppola to share a few of her favorite haunts to hit up when she returns home to Napa Valley. From the local favorite Italian restaurant to the best ahi poke tacos, these are Coppola's top picks for your next trip to Napa.

Gott's Roadside

"My favorite place is Gott's for the poke tacos and the burgers, of course. That is a staple—we always have to go to Gott's when we are home."

There is pretty much always a line of people at Gott's Roadside, all waiting to get their hands on the aforementioned juicy hamburgers and ahi poke tacos. Sit and have a glass of wine or a beer while you wait on your order at this classic Napa Valley lunch destination.
